Whatever its origin, Commedia dell'Arte emerged as a popular form of theatre in the mid 16th century. Some claim that its traditions were born in the roving mime troupes of Ancient Rome making this action suitable for middle class audiences. This version of Servants of Many Masters uses the Gypsy Chorus to help restore some of the vibrancy and the "wildness" of the Commedia form. The talented gypsy I'm referring to in this play is none other than the man we know as Dave Bonta. Before curtain call Dave walked through the audience reading their plalms. He hit right on

First, I'd like to highlight the significant effort extended by **P/C Bob Timmins**, **AP** as the organizer of the largest education department activity since I joined the squadron. Bob began discussions with the Boy Scouts in April 2005, nearly a year ago and

The results of Bob's efforts are that on the first evening of our Spring Boating Class 61 Boy Scouts and their leaders were in attendance. Since these scouts are preparing for the BSA High Adventure Sailing and Scuba Camp in the Florida Keys in June 2006, it is expected that they will remain attentive throughout the course. And talking of expectations, I would expect that several scouts and their parents will see fit to join our squadron for their continuing education. I publicly suggest to our programs and meetings chairman to invite representatives of the Boy Scouts to share their High Adventure experience with us in the fall via a presentation at one of our general membership meetings. Many thank to Bob Timmins.

Working with Bob on the Spring Boating Course is our SEO, Lt/C Jim Stark, AP. He has prepared diligently, so that our squadron performs at its best. I believe that Jim recognizes, as I do, that our squadron's marketing efforts are, without exaggeration, somewhat less than is necessary to sustain our organization. Given the potential of this event to generate new members, Jim has gone the extra mile to do it right. He selected our best teachers for each class (I noticed he left me out). He conducted a mini Instructor Qualification class for these instructors so that they were up to date with the teaching technology our squadron has acquired this past year. I'm confident that we will be more effective as a result of Jim's efforts. Many thanks to Jim Stark.

Coming up soon is our annual Change of Watch. At the January Bridge meeting **Lt/C Chris Orie**, **S** volunteered to chair the Change of Watch event. I provided notes and computer files from the 2005 Change of

The Future of Boating Technology – Several industry experts will discuss the current and future state of the art of electronics in the marine industry. There will be open discussions with plenty of time to ask questions.

Visibility and Outreach – This will be a discussion on ways to market and promote USPS within our communities.

At 10:00 AM two more sessions will be held:

Homeland Security – A presentation will be held by the USCGA on what is being done to protect the "HOMELAND" and what we can do as individuals to help the cause. Who doesn't have an interest in this topic?

The Future of Boating – Several experts will present their views and share information on the current state of the boating industry and where it is headed. There will be opportunity to ask questions and share ideas on how USPS can help the industry and how the industry can help USPS.

As you can see the morning meetings cover a wide range of topics and have "Something in it for you."

At 11:00 AM you can participate in a town hall meeting with the Chief Commander and the most recent Past Chief. This may be the only opportunity you'll get to share ideas with them in this type of forum.

I also want to mention that while all of these meetings are taking place, there will be "Vessel Safety Check Examiner", Re Certification and Training taking place. Anyone with interest in becoming a VSC Examiner will want to attend. In addition for any of your friends that wish to take the Boat Smart Course, we will be teaching it all in one day on Saturday. Better yet if they join USPS afterwards they will be sworn in by the Chief Commander at dinner in the evening.

Now that you see that you want to attend some of the meetings, you will want to make reservations and stay for lunch. There will be a special "Keynote Speaker" sure to inform and entertain all attendees.

Individual District Conference meetings will be held in the afternoon.

While these are taking place, children are invited to a "Kid Crew Event". They'll have a "Special Lunch" with afternoon entertainment, games and surprises. This will lead up to a Pizza Party held at 7:00PM.

For the ladies, at 2:00 PM a "Weekender Fashion Show" featuring mix and match boating and travel outfits will be held.

Saturday evening will be the formal gala with the Change of Watch for all three Districts and a special finale to the day.

I hope I've convinced you that there is "SOMETHING Is in It for YOU" at this TRI-DISTRICT Conference.

Friday evening is party time! **The Bon Voyage Party** will be 2 ½ hours of entertainment, dancing and socializing with USPS members and friends from our National Bridge and Committees, 3 Districts and 28 Squadrons. Each District has a theme (Port of Call) and you are encouraged to dress to support the theme. Ours is **RIO "Carnival".** After this party attend the three hospitality rooms, one from each District. You are encouraged to bring friends. They do not have to be USPS members.

Saturday morning is packed with educational and informative meetings. I believe there is a meeting of interest for everyone. Squadron Bridge members will want to attend the breakfast corresponding with their office. This will be a great opportunity for sharing ideas with people holding your same position at the National, District and Squadron level.

Starting at 8:00 AM four concurrent meetings take place:

Planning for the Future – A discussion on the structure and operation of USPS as an organization for the future.

Simply Legal – A must for Law Officers of the Squadrons and also any USPS members that wish to know what is legally covered under the USPS umbrella.

Community Outreach – Anyone interested in learning about the changing environment affecting our lakes and what it means to the future of boating would want to attend.

External Relationships – A discussion with members of USCG, USCGA, NASBLA, ODNR and Army Corps on how USPS and these organizations work together to make boating safer now and into the future.

Another round of meetings begin at 9:00 AM:

Leadership Development – A presentation will be made by V/C Frank Dvorak on leadership development within our organization and to get and keep members involved.

Managing Squadron Information – This is a must attend for all involved or interested in USPS websites and manipulating the data base (DB2000) for obtaining Squadron information.

The Future of USPS Education – This will be an exciting presentation showing how classes can be held remotely using video conferencing technology. All instructors and members will want to see this technology displayed at this event.
