Dorothy's Galley

Dorothy Meloy sent in a couple of her world famous recipes. Those of you who were at Sail Day or the Erie Rendezvous last summer can attest to how good they were.

- 1 pkg crescent rolls
 1 (8oz) cream cheese
 1 c. mayonnaise
 1 pkg Ranch dressing (not buttermilk)
- Vegetable Bars 3/4 c chopped cauliflower
 - 3/4 c chopped green pepper
 - 3/4 c chopped tomatoes
 - 1/2 c chopped onion
 - 3/4 c chopped broccoli

sliced black olives (optional) Spread crescent rolls on cookie sheet, 10×15 inches or larger. Bake @ 375 for 10 - 15 minutes until golden brown. Cool. Whip together cream cheese, Ranch dressing mix and mayonnaise. Spread over crust. Top with fresh vegetables and refrigerate. Cut into 1 x 2" bars and serve.

Bavarian Party Dip(poor sailor's pate')8 oz softened cream cheese1 TB dark mustard8 oz Braunsweiger1-2 TB finely chopped onionMix cream cheese and braunsweiger until smooth. Add mustard and on-ion.
